Introduction or Anticipatory Set	How you will introduce the lesson in order to get your student engaged and interested?	
Instructional Methods	How will you present the content and information necessary for the students to achieve what your lesson objective states? This includes, modeling, differentiating instruction, lecture, demonstration, student centered learning.	

Checking for Understanding	Include strategies for assessing learning and checking for understanding throughout the lesson. Examples: Include prompts in PowerPoint, Stop every 5-10 minutes to ask students review questions, polling techniques, ask random students to summarize information.
Guided Practice	What assignment/activities will you have students do to practice the objectives? Students demonstrate learning by working through an activity or exercise under the teacher's direct supervision and assistance.
Independent Practice	After students have completed guided practice successfully with teacher supervision and feedback, they are ready to work alone. What assignment/activity will the students complete to demonstrate mastery of the objective? Independent Practice can be at home, in class alone, at work, or community classroom.
Closure or Wrap Up	Actions or statements designed to bring a lesson presentation to a conclusion. Helps students to make sense out of what has just been taught and reinforce the major points.
